Report from the Chair



The Auxiliary had a very successful year with our events and businesses. Our revenue from many of the businesses such as The Hospital Gift Shop, Still Fabulous Thrift Shops and the Clothing Bins have raised more money than in previous years. We are proud of our successes as we strive to fulfill our purpose of providing funding for the many new initiatives; treatment programs; state of the art hospital equipment; research project proposals and most important of all - funding the comforts for children and families at BC Children's Hospital.

The success of the various Auxiliary business initiatives continues both on site and in the community:

- Still Fabulous Thrift Shop and Still Fab 2 (on campus)
- Holiday Card Program
- Clothing Donation Bin Program
- Campus Vendor Program
- & several special events "popping up" in the BCCH Lobby throughout the year.

The dedication of our Auxiliary members, volunteers and staff continue to provide funding for programs which impact all patients & families, including:

- Child Life weekend staffing
- Music Therapy
- Therapeutic Clown Program "MIRTH Unit"
- Healthy Minds Programs for CAPE, In-patients, Eating Disorders & Clinic Out-patient services
- Family Support Library
- Treasure Chest and Volunteer Fun Cart
- Research and up to date equipment required by the hospital teams
- The Centre for Health Complexity.

This past fiscal year the Auxiliary was excited to provide total grants of \$413,450 to BC Children's Hospital Foundation.

Since the inception of the Auxiliary, contributions that total an amazing \$8,588,316!

In addition, the Auxiliary to BCCH Education Endowment Fund has provided grants over \$19,550 to 27 BCCH staff and volunteers in 2024-25, to assist with professional development, ongoing education presentations at national and international pediatric conferences, that ultimately has a positive impact on the reputation for the pediatric care provided at BC Children's Hospital.

The Auxiliary decided to take on a new funding project this past year, making a pledge of \$300,000 towards the development of the new Centre for Health Complexity. The first installment has been paid, with a second one budgeted for 2025-26. The Auxiliary is pleased to support this much needed and specialized centre for children with multiple needs supported by their families.

Our Hospital Gift Shop Supervisor Becky Winkelmann and her volunteers are committed to ensure the Gift Shop provides service and a positive experience for patients, families and staff. The Shop experienced an increased demand for logo wear based on the BCCH Foundation campaign Small is Mighty T-shirts, sweatshirts and hoodies this past year. The Gift Shop offers an expanding line of merchandise along with a variety of logo items.

The Clothing Donation Bins has expanded and is experiencing continued growth in its program. We have welcomed a new host – Richmond Recycling Depot, who now sponsor two bins at their Lyons Lane location since March 2025. We have over 40 clothing donation bins placed in the Lower Mainland and three on Vancouver Island. The program, an Auxiliary's partnership with the Salvation Army National Recycling Organization (SANRO), continues to grow.

Still Fabulous Thrift Shop & Still Fab2 – at Entrance 93 on the hospital campus, continue it's popularity with regular staff and customers' daily visits. Our Staff and Advisory Committee volunteers strive to offer new retail programs to boost sales and generate increased clothing donations.

The Holiday Card program continues its successful partnership with London Drugs. Forty of their stores carried the Auxiliary to BCCH Holiday cards throughout the Holiday season. The committee was temporarily disheartened by the timing of the Canada Post strike – however our volunteers tried alternative solutions and plan for robust sales in 2025.

This past year 1,795 volunteers were assigned to BC Children's Hospital, Sunny Hill Health Centre, and BC Women's Hospital & Health Centre, contributing 78,105 hours. Volunteers support patients and families every day and in many different roles. Each assignment makes an important contribution to the patient and family experience. Our Auxiliary Board continues to incorporate the purpose of the Auxiliary to Sunny Hill and work alongside the Auxiliary to BC Women's Hospital & Health Centre.

The Auxiliary is thankful for the support of Volunteer Resources staff - Pat Gillis, Patricia Pon, Becky Winkelmann (Gift Shop Supervisor) and Judy Hanvey (Thrift Shop Supervisor) for their continued commitment to the Auxiliary. We want to give special thanks to all the Volunteer Resources team! We could not do this without their support!

My thanks also to our Auxiliary Board Members for their incredible dedication and ongoing commitment. Our Auxiliary can celebrate the successes achieved this past year, and as we look into the next, we are confident we have the tools and the talent to continue supporting the patients and families of BC Children's Hospital.

On a personal note I am finishing my time as Chair of the Auxiliary. I have enjoyed my years as part of the Auxiliary Board. As Chair, I have learned so much during my time and I want to thank the amazing Board members past and present for their support, guidance, energy and commitment. Such an amazing and dedicated group of volunteers to be involved with. I will stay on as Past Chair for now. I continue to believe in the outstanding work and commitment of the Auxiliary.

The Gift Shop had another fantastic year. With a record breaking annual gross sales of over \$500,000 (an increase of 20% over last year), the Gift Shop played an important part in the Auxiliary to BCCH's funding of patients and families programs at BC Children's Hospital.

We are extremely honoured with the results our Gift Shop team has achieved in 2024-25. The Gift Shop is not only where customers come to look for interesting gifts and logo wear, it is also a hub within the Hospital for staff and a destination stop where patients and families look forward to visiting after appointments.

The Gift Shop strives to carry Canada-made products, and welcomed suppliers for clothing from Quebec and a new line of teas from Victoria, BC this past year. In addition, the BCCH logo wear, particularly the Small is Mighty line, continues to be extremely popular.

Still Fabulous Thrift Shop, a joint venture of the Auxiliary to BC Children's Hospital & Auxiliary to BC Women's Hospital & Health Centre, experienced some exciting growth with the opening of Still Fab2 at Entrance 93 in the BC Women's Hospital Lobby.

Thanks to the dedication of our volunteers the hospital staff, patients and families are enjoying some sweet bargains. Now that a full year has passed we can assess the desired product for successful sales in order to cater to the unique clientele.



With much dedication and the support of our volunteers and customers, Still Fabulous had gross sales for the year of \$317,757, an increase of 12% over the previous year. *



This achievement reflects the hard work and commitment of Thrift Shop Supervisor Judy Hanvey, our dedicated team of volunteers, and the management committee. The shop provides gently used high quality men's, women's and children's clothing, as well as shoes, jewelry, accessories and housewares to our loyal and new customers. Effective October 1, 2023 a new 5-year lease commenced at our Main Street Still Fabulous Thrift Shop.

Clothing Donation Bins Program

This past year was a record-breaking one for the Clothing Donation Bin Program. With a total gross revenue of \$237,097, this was an increase of 27%.

The Auxiliary to BCCH continues our commitment to help reduce textile waste. We contributed to keeping 1,298,250 lbs of textile waste off the landfill through this program in 2024-2025!

The Hospital was thrilled to see the return of the Auxiliary's donation bin on campus. Placed near entrance 11, this new bin is serving the needs of the Hospital community that wish to donate gently used items to our program.

The Clothing Donation Bin Program also welcomed a new host this past year. After responding to an RFP for bins placement at the Richmond Recycling Center, we were awarded the contract. Through collaboration with the City of Richmond, two textile donations bins were installed at the Richmond Recycling Depot for residents to drop off used textile and clothing. Within the first three months of installation, approximately 14,670 pounds of materials were collected for re-use and end-of-life recycling.

Operations for this program has kept us busy. With the order of new bins and the refurbishing of some old bins, we have placed and replaced bins around the city thus making our bins more convenient and safer for the community. In 2006 the Auxiliary to BC Children’s Hospital and Salvation Army National Recycling Organization (SANRO) formed a unique social enterprise partnership with the purpose of raising funds for both non-profit organizations, and proceeds are shared between the organizations to benefit their respective causes.


Holiday Card Program

The team is a small but dedicated volunteer committee that works hard behind the scenes packaging cards, processing online orders, and keeping stock up.

This past year we were grateful to have London Drugs come back as a retail partner. The committee packed over 1,000 cards for sales in over 40 select stores, keeping an eye on inventory and delivering stock as needed. We give a huge shout out to London Drugs for their support!

Also a big thank you to our very own Auxiliary to BCCH Gift shop for their display and sales of Holiday Cards. A lobby Christmas tree decorated with our cards outside of the Gift Shop brought a festive feel and allowed everyone to see each and every card. Please come take a look at our tree in December 2025!



Sales in 2024 were challenging with a postal strike mid-program that hampered our ability to mail orders. Every effort was made by both committee and purchasers to see the cards were delivered and received. We're happy to report \$27,504 was raised in support of various programs and services at BCCH.

Vendor Program

With 250 booked days in 2024-2025, the BCCH Lobby Vendor Program realized over \$11,000 in 2024-2025. This Hospital-favorite program welcomed Mike’s Kettlecorn and Shipra’s Indian Kitchen to our roster of 12+ regular vendors.

The Vendor Program offers a service for patients, families and staff that attend the Children’s & Women’s Hospitals Campus. It enables revenue generation for the Auxiliary by providing guaranteed space at the BCCH lobby of the Oak Street Campus.



Treasure Chest

The Treasure Chest is a wonderful program that provides boxes of joy to children in outpatient and inpatient clinics within the hospital to select a “treat” at the end of their visit or treatment. The Treasure Chest program is serving 62 Clinics including inpatient areas. This marks an increase of 50% compared to last year.



Fun Cart

The Auxiliary to BCCH is proud to fund Fun Cart! We are thankful to the amazing 89 volunteers that donated 4,296 hours in 2024-2025 bringing a cart full of interactive activities to distract and engage patients and siblings at BC Children's Hospital.

The Fun Cart provides interaction, play and distraction to patients, siblings and families waiting for appointments in treatment areas and outpatient clinics. We also assist with as-needed special requests for support to various hospital programs.

Therapeutic Clowning



In 2024 the therapeutic clowning team, also known as the MiRTH unit (Medicine Incorporating Remedies that Tickle the Heart), made 2,507 inpatient visits and 960 outpatient visits with patients and families. They had a total of 3,467 interactions with patients and families, and another 273 while at special events. The therapeutic clowning team is made up of 3 part-time staff members. 2024 marked 30 years of therapeutic clowning at BC Children's Hospital.

Funding and Programs Supported



Education Endowment Fund

The Auxiliary to BC Children's Hospital Education Endowment Fund provides financial assistance to volunteers and eligible support staff healthcare providers pursuing education or ongoing professional development. These opportunities aim to enhance the care and experience of children and families at BC Children's Hospital and Sunny Hill Health Centre.

In 2024, the Auxiliary proudly awarded a total of 27 grants worth a total of \$19,550 to 9 volunteers and 17 BCCH staff members.

Mary Lou Hunter Award

This annual award is in memory of Mary Lou Hunter, Auxiliary to BCCH Board member, fundraiser and a Child Life volunteer who brought compassion, humour, love and exceptional commitment to her volunteerism at BC Children's Hospital. 

Enhancing Hospital Volunteer Work through Tropical Botany and Marine Biology Knowledge

The grant I received from the Education Endowment Fund allowed me attend a trip study to Hawaii's Big Island and learn skills to enhance patients' quality of life by assisting them in my volunteer assignment as a Navigator.

The trip study focused on marine biology and tropical flora research. I can draw on my experiences from Hawaii when I interact with patients, giving anxious patients interesting facts about marine life or tropical plants can be a relaxing diversion. I could tell them a about a Hawaiian sea turtle, for example, or about a unique tropical flower, like the well-known Ohia tree, which is a native plant. These tales can provide patients a mental reprieve from the strains of the hospital setting and make the visit there more memorable and pleasurable.

In addition, the patience I've gained from studying the intricate interactions among Hawaii's ecosystems will improve my capacity to maintain composure and concentration under pressure, no matter how hectic or demanding the hospital environment gets.

I look forward to contributing to the creation of a more hospitable, therapeutic, and patient-centered environment by introducing natural materials, enhancing wayfinding, and supporting holistic therapies.

Incorporating ecological knowledge into volunteer work in healthcare not only improves patients but also strengthens human-nature bonds.





Summary


